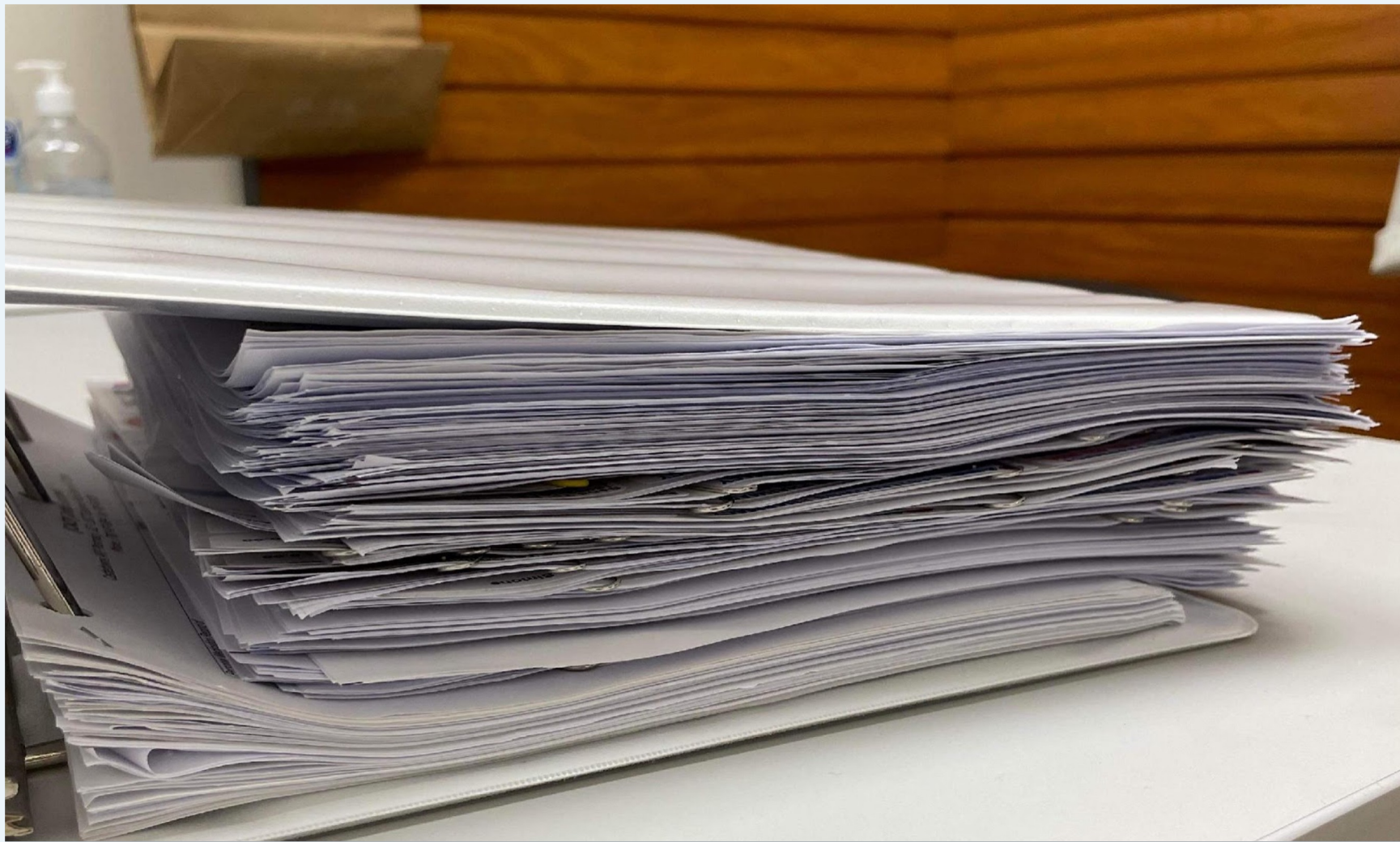

Documentation review: Generate Documentation

Indication

Patient History Allergies and intolerances, relevant medical, family, social history, past and current medications, non-prescription medications, immunizations, laboratory and diagnostic data.

Efficacy Patient therapy likely to meet efficacy targets.

Adherence No adherence concerns to therapy.

Monitoring Parameters Symptom improvement, Symptom resolution, and eGFR

Adverse Effects GI Upset and Urine Discolouration

Plan Pharmacist to prescribe: Nitrofurantoin Monohydrate Macrocrystal.
Patient to follow-up with Pharmacist with any questions or concerns.
Pharmacist to notify primary care provider.



3. Seamless Integration

Patient

CC: Urinary Tract Infection Assessment

Data:

PT provided informed consent for pharmacist assessment and reports signs/symptoms:
-Dysuria, urinary frequency and urgency, suprapubic pain, mild hematuria
No redflags detected.

Relevant medical history, social history, and medication history reviewed.

Relevant monitoring:
Symptom Improvement, Symptom Resolution, and eGFR

Other relevant information: No recent antibiotic use

Assessment: Patient presents with symptoms of uncomplicated urinary tract infection. Patient may benefit from Pharmacist prescribing and/or recommendations.

Plan:

- Patient to immediately follow-up with pharmacist or alternative health care provider if development of complicated symptoms such as fever, nausea/vomiting, or flank pain, or if symptoms worsen or do not improve in 48 -72 hours
- Patient counselled on possible non-pharm measures (E.g. increased water intake, cranberry supplements) that may be beneficial, but lack conclusive evidence) along with strategies such as wiping from front to back to limit bacteria transmission.
- Provided option for patient to fill prescription at pharmacy of choice
- Pharmacist notified patient's primary care provider via Fax today

Pharmacist provided counselling on monitoring of conditions and adverse effects from the therapies such as: GI Upset and Urine Discolouration

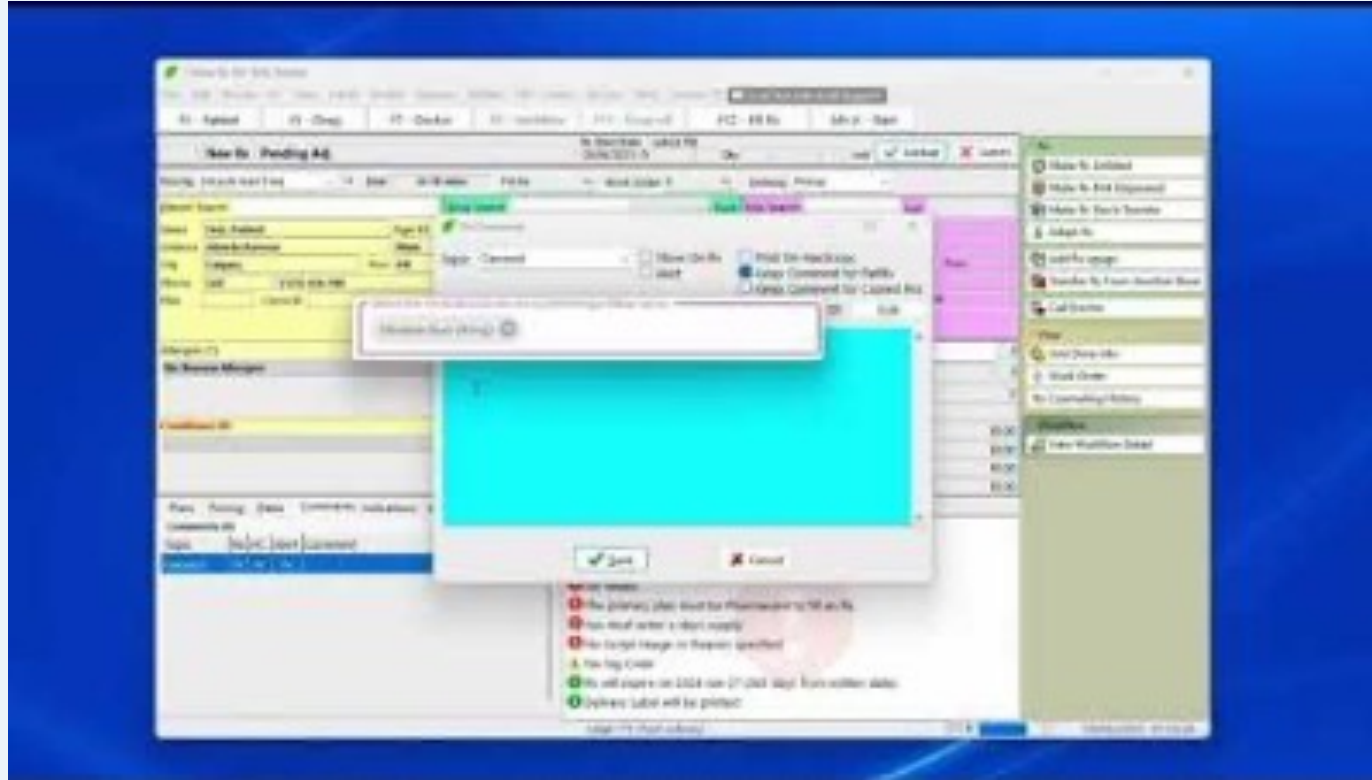

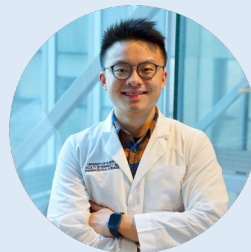
